Venue: Farley Hill, St. Peter, Barbados. The entire Park shall be on reserve for the SDA Event. Access shall be controlled.

Dress: Comfortable and modest for Sabbath, outdoor worship; no trousers for females, no shorts. All members are invited to bring a Folding chair, Family, Food and come to Farley Hill on the Fourteenth for Fellowship... and oh, bring a Fumbrella. Members are also asked to travel with adequate drinking water.

Streaming: The event will NOT be streamed live.

TRANSPORTATION: Each district is encouraged to provide transportation from the churches within the district to the venue. A large bus or a number of buses should be arranged. Members should not be left to take public transport. Carpooling is also advised. Buses should be labelled SDA Farley Hill. A member who lives near a church which he or she does not attend may make arrangements with the leadership of that church to travel on their bus by contacting the Pastor or the Elder providing that there is space on the bus and the arrangement is made in advance.

PARKING: A limited number of vehicles will be allowed to park inside Farley Hill upon presentation of a special pass. This space will be reserved for workers and volunteers acknowledged by the event management. All others are asked to park across the street on lands that would be prepared and provided specifically for the purpose. The Barbados Police Service will be providing traffic and crowd control. Priority parking will be provided for the overflow of volunteers who may not get parking inside Farley Hill. A Shuttle bus for the aged and differently abled would be provided from the outside car park into Farley Hill itself.

WRISTBANDS: Upon arrival every participant/member will be presented with a wristband which MUST be worn and displayed by each participant throughout the entire day. This is for the security and safety of our people.

MEDICATION: PLEASE bring any medication that you are currently taking for any conditions you may have.

FIRST AID: A medical team shall be on hand to deal with minor issues.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

For the safety of all attendees, it is imperative that security guards are on-duty round the clock. Thus, the help of as many adult volunteers as possible is needed. All Deacons and Elders are encouraged to sign up and be a part of the security team. The Barbados Police force and Island constables will be on hand to provide support.
